1. Student evaluations

We discussed a possible change in rules to require student evaluations for classes with fewer than 10 students; one goal would be to assure sufficient data for annual evaluations. We may instead suggest that alternative means of evaluation (class visits) be used in small classes.

2. GPAs and evaluations

Gary Patterson provided some data on student evaluations and class GPAs. We discussed how to use the data, for example, what information would be made available.

3. COBC membership

We discussed some issues regarding who is and is not a member of this committee.

4. Dean Hill and summer scheduling

Dean Hill explained some issues regarding summer teaching (see the March 22 minutes). He suggested summer research grants to make up for the drop in summer teaching opportunities for some professors. We discussed bigger classrooms and possible amendments to the policy this committee passed last academic year on summer teaching assignments. For now, we'll wait and see on the last point.

We also discussed writing a letter to express our concerns regarding the new policy and how it was made.
