Outstanding graduate committed to educating children, giving back



College of Education student Aaron Kawaja was honored during Spring Commencement Sunday, May 5, with the Outstanding Graduate Award. Given each commencement by the USF Alumni Association, the award recognizes the graduating senior who embodies leadership, school spirit, community service, character and scholarship. Aaron graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Science in Education with certification in Elementary Education and Exceptional Student Education. She is a member of Kappa Delta Pi, the education honor society, and was always on the Dean's list. She accomplished that despite completing four internships and volunteering at Metropolitan Ministries in Tampa and the Tampa Heights Junior Civic Association. Her commitment to education was formed during a missionary trip from Nairobi to Mombasa. She looked down from a train car in Tanzania and spotted a barefoot boy

covered in dirt and wearing just a torn shirt. He gestured to her in prayer and then squiggled in the dirt: He wanted a pencil. She immediately threw the contents of her art supply bag out the window and dedicated herself to educating children. Aaron plans to teach elementary school and then pursue a Master's in Social Work.

Spring Commencement 2013 sees hundreds graduate: "It's your turn"



The Mahaffey Theater was filled with students, family and friends for Spring 2013 Commencement. Many students expressed their thoughts about the big day by decorating their mortar boards (photos above). Some thanked their parents, others honored their dreams and one remembered his grandfather's service in World War II. About 350 students participated in the ceremonies, part of the 454-member graduating class that included 397 undergraduate degrees and 57 graduate degrees. Eleven students graduated Summa Cum Laude, 37 Magna Cum Laude and 35 Cum Laude. "I know I speak for all of us at USF St. Petersburg when I tell you how proud we are of each of you," Interim Regional Chancellor Bill Hogarth told the graduates. "Now it's your turn: Your turn to challenge and inspire us. To become the leaders of your generation. To set new goals and new ideals. To create a world better than the one you joined." Students call experimental course on field research a big success



By all indications, an experimental environmental science course taught for the first time during the spring semester was a big success. The undergraduate selected topics course, "Field Experiential Methods," combined time in the classroom with hands-on field research in Tampa Bay. It was designed by David Fries, director of the Ecosystems Technology Group at the College of Marine Science. "This is a terrific example of recent collaborations and expanding opportunities that exist between USF St. Petersburg and the USF **College of Marine Science**," said Frank Biafora, Ph.D., dean of the USFSP **College of Arts and Sciences**. Students used an underwater sensing device to gather data about water in parts of Tampa Bay. The device, created by Fries originally to gather data about red tide, is "like having a human in a can," Fries said. The data gathered by the students can be fed into computer models used to predict tides and storm surge, said Fries, who hopes the student work will be published in a research journal.
