Interim AVP for Academic Affairs Announced



James S. Malek, PhD has accepted the appointment of Interim Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs at USF St. Petersburg for the 2004-05 academic year. During his 35 years in higher education, Malek has achieved notable success for his work on accreditation, assessment and strategic planning. He begins his work on campus June 21.

Most recently, Malek has served Rollins College in Winter Park and Ithaca College in Ithaca, NY as chief academic officer. Before becoming a provost, Malek served august institutions such as University of Nevada Las Vegas, Florida Atlantic University and University of Nebraska at Omaha as dean of Arts and Sciences.

Malek earned his baccalaureate degree at Earlham College, his Master's and PhD at the University of Chicago. He was a Woodrow Wilson Fellow and attended the Institute of Educational Management at Harvard.
