Departmental Overview:

The Library Research and Instruction Department is responsible for providing reference and research assistance, library instruction, and outreach efforts for the students and faculty of the University of South Florida St. Petersburg.

The department consists of 6 Librarians (Tina Neville, Gary Austin, Deb Henry, Camielle Swenson, Tony Stamatoplos, and Kaya van Beynen). Additionally the librarians, Patricia Pettijohn and Jim Schnur contribute to the department by providing reference support and by teaching library instruction sessions. LeAnna Kiggins works as a part time Library Assistant in the Research and Instruction Department

Significant Departmental Accomplishments in 2014/2015:

- 74% (25 of 34) of the faculty requesting library instruction sessions for their courses responded to a survey about the librarian's presentation quality. On a scale of 1-5 (5=strongly agree), the mean score for the statement "The information presented was useful to my students." was 4.88 and the mean score for the statement "The presentation was clear and easy to follow." was 4.88.
- Tony Stamatoplos, Tina Neville, and Jim Schnur were awarded a USFSP internal faculty research grant to study the data management environment at USFSP. This is the first time a librarian has been awarded a USFSP internal research grant.
- Deb Henry and Tina Neville were awarded the inaugural Florida Librarian Association Research Award for their 2014 publication in the *Journal of Academic Librarianship*.
- Departmental faculty continue to be highly productive in their research activities with three peer reviewed articles, one book chapter, two articles in professional journals, three national or state conference presentations, and three national or state poster presentations.
- All members of the department are actively involved in professional service. Kaya van Beynen chairs a national library committee and Tony Stamatoplos serves on a national committee. Tina Neville, Deb Henry, Gary Austin, Camielle Swenson, and Tony Stamatoplos are all active on Florida Library Association committees.
- Library research and social events continue to expand as evidenced by a 52% increase in the number of events and an 11% increase in attendance.
- Camielle Swenson was hired on a full-time, promotion-earning line as the Instructor Librarian for Outreach.
- For the first year, statistics are available to gauge usage of research guides and learning modules. Initial results are promising with 14438 page views of the research guides and 6726 page views of the instructional modules.
- Tony Stamatoplos was promoted to University Library starting in the 2015/16 academic year.
- Deb Henry was appointed the Interim Library Dean in June 2015.

Instruction:

Instruction sessions to classes show a steady increase over the one year and five year spans. One-on-one research sessions with students and faculty have also increased over the last five years. Some of the increase in individual sessions over the last year is related to a specific course assignment in marketing that encouraged students to set up one-on-one or small group consultations with Gary Austin, the business liaison. Workshops on library related topics have held fairly steady over the years. The overall decrease in workshop offerings and attendance is because of a very large number of online learning related workshops that were offered between 2011 and 2013 as the campus moved to a new course management platform.

Reference:

Overall, in-depth research instruction declined slightly in 2014/2015. The one-on-one instruction sessions were up by 3% over last year but the number of in-depth questions answered at the service desk was down by 12%. However, in-depth questions answered this year represent 20% of the total number of questions (364 of 1818) asked at the service desk which is an increased percentage overall.

The number of Basic Library Skills and Research Strategy questions fielded at the service desk continues to decline. This decline, was a major reason for the change in Reference service structure enacted in 2012; librarians now provide on call assistance for instruction or research questions rather than sitting at a desk waiting for questions.

The number of virtual reference questions had a significant decline over the past year with chat questions down by 73%. The lower usage may be related to several things. Since the new library web page went live at the end of the 2013/14 academic year, the link to the Ask-A-Librarian chat service became less obvious and is available on fewer pages. In addition, the statewide chat service moved to a new software platform in May 2015. Unlike the previous version of the chat software, the new platform does not allow tracking of questions initiated by USFSP students that are answered on the statewide chat desk. Since many of the USFSP questions are answered by librarians outside of the USFSP system, this platform change will report lower numbers than the actual usage.

Events:

The Nelson Poynter Memorial Library continues to provide numerous events and activities for students and faculty at USFSP. The events range in nature from scholarly lectures (such as the Student Research Colloquium series), to wellness functions (such as the Therapy Dogs International visits during exam weeks), to social gatherings (such as the welcome party for new USFSP graduate students). In the 2014/15 academic year, 38 unique events were held, representing a 52% increase over the previous year and a 153% increase over the last five years. The attendance at library events shows an 11% increase over the previous year.

5. Support fellow department librarians with their continued research and service endeavors.
6. Appoint a departmental member as a point person to the library web master to check for new content, updates, errors, etc. relating to our department
7. Work on getting the AAL widget back onto more of the library web pages to increase use.
8. Increase departmental communication and collaboration with instructional designers
9. Coordinate the USFSP Student Research Journal if faculty review board becomes available
