Pre-Vet President Lands Guide Dogs Internship

This fall marks the first formal USFSP student internship with the Southeastern Guide Dogs (SEGD) organization. And Bethany Porcelli, president and founder of the USFSP Pre-Vet Society and a Biology senior, jumped at the chance to participate in this exciting new partnership.

"I applied to the Genetics and Reproduction internship because SEGD has a great reputation in the non-profit animal field," said Porcelli. "They're educating me about a field that I was unfamiliar with, while providing me with a career-furthering experience."

As an intern for the Genetics and Reproduction Team, Porcelli goes through the intensive process of choosing a canine to be a "breeder," or those with the best genes to create better guide dogs -- good health and temperament, for example.

"Bethany's experiences at Southeastern Guide Dogs will be invaluable to her as she pursues her future career in veterinary medicine," said Dr. Norine Noonan, Biology professor. "This is exactly the kind of relevant experience that we both encourage and facilitate for USFSP students."

"I'm really grateful to Bethany for founding the Pre-Vet Society and blazing a new trail for our Biology students," said Dr. Frank Biafora, dean of the College of Arts & Sciences. "I couldn't be more proud of her achievements and opening the door for others."

TRIO Hosts Event for First-Time Freshmen

A TRIO panel of USFSP faculty and staff gathered recently to address 20 freshmen who are the first in their family to attend college. These faculty and staff share a commonality with the students they talked to: They were first-generation college students too.

"My biggest recommendation to FTIC (first time in college) students is to get and stay connected. Reach out and find mentors. Ask questions. Expect answers," said Dr. Tiffany Chenneville, associate professor and chair of the Department of Psychology, and a TRIO panelist. "Choose a path and follow it ... a road with twists and turns will create opportunities."

In 2010, USFSP was awarded a five-year, \$1.1 million grant from the Department of Education to support its TRIO program. The campus offers a wide range of academic and personal support services to help undergraduate students be successful as they pursue their educational goals.

"I am always inspired by the stories of our students," said Terrye Wilson, USFSP's director of TRIO Student Support Services.

USFSP's Chitra Iyer Presents at National Conference

Chitra Iyer, USFSP's new Regional Associate Vice Chancellor of Administration, traveled to San Antonio recently to present at the National Conference of the College & University Professional Association for Human Resources. Iyer, who joined USFSP from Ohio State University over the summer, spoke to the adverse impact of chronic cost-cutting on an institution's ability to make strategic investments.

"HR can contribute to growth and critical academic priorities by helping academic leaders think differently about staffing," said Iyer. "The staffing model should position a university to meet department objectives, now and in the future."

In addition to leading USFSP's HR Department, Iyer will serve as a key player in guiding implementation of the new Strategic Plan.
