Dedication of Coquina Hall

On April 12 the University of South Florida will formally dedicate a new classroom-activity building on Bayboro Harbor, completing the first phase of construction plans for the University's St. Petersburg regional campus.

Coquina Hall, which will accommodate an expanded schedule of classes and campus activities, will be dedicated at 11 a.m. by dignitaries including USF President John Lott Brown, Regent Raleigh Greene, St. Petersburg Mayor Corinne Freeman and other University, local and state officials.

Campus Dean John Hinz announced plans for Coquina Hall in 1981 following the state legislature's appropriation of construction funds. Building was delayed until site and design plans were completed in 1982. Plans subsequently were modified in 1983 to lower the building's height to meet Federal Aviation Authority requirements for nearby Albert Whitted Airport.

The new \$2.8 million hall has 35,540 square feet. It includes a student cafeteria, bookstore, activities and staff offices, showers and locker rooms, a photo lab, 20 faculty offices and 10 classrooms. The steel and concrete structure is finished in pre-cast panels of crushed coquina shells and coral cemented in a limestone mixture. It is similar in design to the campus' Nelson Poynter Library and Bayboro Hall, which were constructed in 1980.

The hall also features an art lab with kiln room. Three of the classrooms are doubled sized.

Coquina Hall and an adjacent operations and receiving building were designed by McLane, Rados, Alfonso Architects, Tampa, and built by Metric Constructors, Inc., St. Petersburg.

Dedication of Coquina Hall

On April 12 the University of South Florida will formally dedicate a new classroom-activity building on Bayboro Harbor, completing the first phase of construction plans for the University's St. Petersburg regional campus.

Coquina Hall, which will accommodate an expanded schedule of classes and campus activities, will be dedicated at 11 a.m. by dignitaries including USF President John Lott Brown, Regent Raleigh Greene, St. Petersburg Mayor Corinne Freeman and other University, local and state officials.

Campus Dean John Hinz announced plans for Coquina Hall in 1981 following the state legislature's appropriation of construction funds. Building was delayed until site and design plans were completed in 1982. Plans subsequently were modified in 1983 to lower the building's height to meet Federal Aviation Authority requirements for nearby Albert Whitted Airport.

The new \$2.8 million hall has 35,540 square feet. It includes a student cafeteria, bookstore, activities and staff offices, showers and locker rooms, a photo lab, 20 faculty offices and 10 classrooms. The steel and concrete structure is finished in pre-cast panels of crushed coquina shells and coral cemented in a limestone mixture. It is similar in design to the campus' Nelson Poynter Library and Bayboro Hall, which were constructed in 1980.

The hall also features an art lab with kiln room. Three of the classrooms are double sized.
