## Juvenile Welfare Board Meeting : 1956 : 01 : 18 : Minutes

Juvenile Welfare Board of Pinellas County.

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Meeting of January 18, 1956

Held in Clearwater

The regular meeting of the Juvenile Welfare Board was held on January 18, 1956 in the Juvenile Court Chambers, Court House, Clearwater.

Present: Mrs. Elizabeth Skinner Jackson, Chairman; Mrs. John Strickland, Secretary; Mrs. Baya Harrison; Mrs. H. W. Holland; Mr. Floyd Christian; and Judge Charles O. Parks, Jr. Also present were the Director, Dr. Herbert D. Williams and Dr. George H. Finck.

The minutes of the December meeting were read and approved.

Motion: Mrs. Holland moved and Mrs. Harrison seconded a motion, which  
Expenditures carried, that expenditures for December 30, 1955 and January 15, 1956 as listed on checks #4254 through #4283 in the General Operating Account and check #31 in the Trustee Account be approved for payment.

Financial statements for December 1955 were reviewed and approved.

A report of children in foster care for December was presented and explained by Dr. Williams.

Dr. Williams requested approval of Dr. Finck's attendance at the psychological meeting in Jacksonville on January 23 through 26.

Motion: Mrs. Holland moved and Mrs. Strickland seconded a motion that approval  
Dr. Finck for Dr. Finck's attendance at this meeting be granted. The motion carried.

Dr. Williams reported on the status of the adoption procedures for Baby Girl Frazier.

Motion: Mr. Christian moved that Dr. Williams tell the Children's Service  
Baby Girl Bureau that they make haste to settle the Baby Girl Frazier case  
Frazier and that the Board believes 60 days sufficient time to determine whether Baby Girl Frazier is to be released by her parents for adoption. Judge Parks seconded the motion, which carried.

The Director reported that the Ryan boy is continuing in foster care pending permanent plans.

Letters regarding the Eighth Annual Report were read by the Director.

The TV program scheduled for February 7th was discussed and the Director was asked to set up a program which will include the Board members and a moderator to be selected. The questions and material to be covered are to be prepared by the Juvenile Welfare Board staff for the Board.

Judge Parks reported on Juvenile Court activities.

Dr. Williams reported that the Ministerial Association had agreed to finance marriage and family counseling service being carried on by Mrs. Dame through September.

The Board set the next meeting date for February 15 at 10:00 A.M.
