MINUTES OF DECEMBER 16, 1947

The Pinellas County Juvenile Welfare Board met December 16, 1947 at 7:30 P. M. in St. Petersburg at Mrs. Holland's residence. Members present were Judge Marshall, Mrs. Holland, Mr. Belcher and Mrs. Bartlett.

The minutes of November 25 and December 9 were read and approved.

Judge Marshall reported that Mrs. Ninabelle Dame did not accept the position and salary offered her at the last Board meeting.

Motion:  
Mrs. Dame                      He moved that Mrs. Dame be employed as a case worker and social welfare worker at a salary of \$3,300.00 a year, plus \$1,200.00 travel allowance; that Chief Probation Officer Al Rogero be requested to recommend her to the Board of County Commissioners for appointment as an Assistant Probation Officer without pay; and that she be assigned to the Juvenile Court and Probation Department for service. Mrs. Bartlett seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

Motion:  
Mr. Patrick                     Judge Marshall moved that the travel allowance to Assistant Probation Officer Ed Patrick be increased to \$110.00 per month, retroactive to October 1, 1947. Mr. Belcher seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

Judge Marshall instructed the secretary to write Mr. Bogue for some definite statement from him and Mr. and Mrs. Cowell concerning the status of the Juvenile Home.

Mrs. Bartlett suggested that a letter of thanks for the Crowe survey be sent to the Junior League.

Judge Marshall suggested that the County Commissioners be asked to keep the books for the Board.

It was also suggested that the Personnel Committee keep looking for a director.

A letter from the Court Committee concerning the condition of the Court chambers in St. Petersburg was read and tabled, although Mr. Belcher said he would ask the County Commissioners to mend the plaster and paint the walls of the court room.

The meeting adjourned till January 8, 1948 in Clearwater at 3:00 P. M.
