Emergency Meeting, June 13, 1972

PRESENT: Mrs. H. W. Holland, Chairman; Mrs. William C. M. Bissell, who acted as Secretary; Dr. Robert E. Coleman, Jr.; Juvenile Judges Jack A. Page and William L. Walker. Also present: Dr. George H. Finck, Director, and Dr. Raymond L. Edwards, Assistant Director.

MOTION Emergency Session Judge Page moved, and Dr. Coleman seconded a motion which passed, to declare an emergency session of the Board.

MOTION Addition to License Board Staff

Judge Page moved, and Dr. Coleman seconded a motion which passed, to add to the License Board budget a third supervisor of day care at a salary of \$7,966.44 plus \$1,000.00 additional mileage and to invite Miss Jefferson to discuss additional staff needs with the Board in the Fall.

Judge Page moved, and Mrs. Bissell seconded a motion which passed, to authorize Dr. Coleman to inspect the Homemaker Service in Cincinnati, Ohio and the Board to pay any necessary expenses.

MOTION Information and Referral Service Judge Walker moved, and Mrs. Bissell seconded a motion which carried, to approve the United Way request of \$15,000.00 for the Information and Referral Service for one year beginning August 1, 1972 and to transfer \$2,500 from the Contingency fund for the months of August and September, 1972, with the proviso that the program be evaluated periodically.

MOTION Approval of 1972-73 Budget Dr. Coleman moved, and Mrs. Bissell seconded a motion which carried, to approve the 1972-73 Budget, as amended, and to certify it to the Board of County Commissioners.
