SAPL PRESENTS FLUTE AND HARP CONCERT AT USF ST. PETERSBURG OCT. 22

ST. PETERSBURG, FLA. (Oct. 5, 1989) -- The Society for Advancement of Poynter Library will present "Fall Fantasia," a concert featuring Kay Borkowski on flute and Kathryn Holm on harp, at 5 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 22. The concert will be held in Bayboro Hall 130 on USF's St. Petersburg campus.

The program will feature compositions by Persichetti and a selection of French pieces, and will include commentary by Borkowski.

Kay Borkowski formerly was the principal flutist with the Jacksonville Symphony, the Fort Wayne Philharmonic, the South Carolina Philharmonic and the Augusta Symphony orchestras, as well as the Indiana and South Carolina Chamber orchestras. She received a bachelor's degree in performance from Indiana University and a master's degree in music theory from Ohio State University. She is married to Dr. Francis T. Borkowski, president of USF.

Kathryn Holm, a professor of harp at USF, now is in her 12th season as principal harpist with the Florida Orchestra. She studied with the internationally acclaimed Alice Chalifoux, retired principal harpist of the Cleveland Orchestra and director of the Salzedo School. She holds a bachelor's degree in music from the North Carolina School of the Arts, and a master's degree in harp performance from the Cleveland Institute of Music.

SAPL is a non-profit organization that promotes the on-going expansion of the library's collections and facilities. The concert, for members and prospective members of SAPL, will be the group's main program for the fall. A reception will follow the event.
