USF St. Petersburg Committee to Begin Search for New Campus Leader

The University of South Florida St. Petersburg announces a meeting of the President's Advisory Committee for the USF St. Petersburg Vice President/CEO Search.

Dr. Mark Wilson, director of the College of Business Administration at USF St. Petersburg, has been named chair of the 17-member committee by USF President Judy Genshaft. "I am excited about the search for the new Vice President at USF St. Petersburg, and I look forward to working with an excellent committee of faculty, staff, students, and community members," Wilson said. "We have a lot of work ahead, but I see this search process as an opportunity to bring distinction to USF St. Petersburg within the USF umbrella."

Dr. Jan Greenwood, with the national search firm A.T. Kearney, has been hired by Genshaft to assist the advisory committee in the search. "I'm really looking forward to working with the committee to help them find this leader," she said. Greenwood is an experienced consultant and is familiar with Florida's Sunshine Laws.

Helen Levine will represent St. Petersburg Mayor Rick Baker on the committee. In noting her appointment, she said, "I appreciate President Genshaft including the city in this important decision making process. I look forward to representing the city in this significant decision."
