



Dean's Report to the College of Education's College Council

New Business

SUS Deans Meeting. The SUS Deans of the Colleges of Education will be meeting Monday, October 10, with the Chancellor of the Board of Governors, Frank Brogan, and the Florida Commissioner of Education, Gerard Robinson, to discuss how the SUS Colleges of Education contribute to the state's strategic workforce development mission, to its economic development, and to the education of its students. I plan to provide an update on the outcomes of this meeting after October 19th, when the SUS Deans are scheduled to meet again to discuss follow up plans.

Old Business

Summer School 2012. In the interest of providing a forum for continued discussion and to seek additional information about summer school funding and faculty assignments for 2012, Dean Fueyo has scheduled a meeting with College of Education faculty and Dr. Norine Noonan, Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, for Tuesday, October 11, from 12-1:00 PM in Bay 220, the Chancellor's Conference Room. Among others, faculty have identified several issues of importance: a) admission and high enrollment patterns of COE graduate students in the summer (including tuition waivers); b) maintaining quality of graduate offerings in the summer; and 3) faculty availability to teach in the Pasco Educational Leadership Cohort. Dr. Noonan welcomes the opportunity to meet with the COE faculty and engage in this important conversation.

Graduate Recruiter Search. Chancellor Sullivan has provided funds to the Colleges of Education and Arts and Sciences to hire a visiting recruiter to assist with graduate student recruiting and marketing. Sixty-five applications have been received. Once eligible applicants have been identified in the pool, the review committee of Wendy Baker, Cynthia Leung, Lyman Dukes, and Dean Fueyo plans to invite individuals to campus to interview. The goal is to complete the process by the end of the October.
