Jim Schnur, acclaimed author, historian and speaker presents:

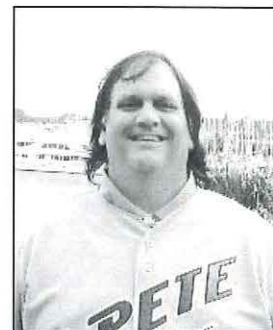
